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What is the Safe System in Practice?


Intensive approach to raise capability and change the conversation in two days

- Cross-sector enrolments
- 7 presentations, 1 problem solving case study

Piloted to 200 people in 2012

- 2013 10 courses 60 per course
- 8 different locations
- About 800 people trained so far








The case study kept my attention to each speaker. The team were highlighting key aspects of our case study as the speakers presented them.


