


America network map





United Kingdom network map








Euro Velo (Europe) network map






Full Potential NZ Cycle network map

Great Rides

- Premium cycling products
- Predominantly off-road trails
- High levels of investment
- <u>Customer</u> Variety of trails suitable for all ages with skill level from novice to experienced cyclists

Heartland Rides

- Predominantly on-road routes
- Scenic backcountry roads
- Low levels of investment
- <u>Customer</u> Suitable for experienced, confident cyclists









Assessing on-road cycle routes (Heartland Rides)

- Traffic volume
- Traffic speed
- Road shoulder width






